I personally have very little coding experience, and I was able to set up a distribution mechanism (which required parsing a JSON payload and constructing an array) for certain categories of requests, which allowed us to apply varying start/end dates, assignments, and tags. There is also a wide array of comprehensive documentation available on YouTube, Microsoft Forums, and other sources that further facilitates the learning process and provides solutions to common challenges. Odds are, you aren't the first group to experience a given need, and there are plenty of forums online on which people discuss solutions to your issues. Additionally, Power Automate integrates with other popular Microsoft applications such as Outlook, Teams, SharePoint, and Planner, as well as some non-Microsoft applications, making it even more potent and flexible.

Power Automate has a few great customization options that you'll likely want to use for your Intake Management tool. Users can create category buckets, enabling easy organization and prioritization of intake requests. Automatic assignments based on predefined rules or parameters ensure that tasks are assigned to the right team or individual. Automatic start and due dates can be set based on custom questions, category buckets, or other relevant factors. This enables efficient tracking and timely completion of tasks. The integration with Teams and Planner allows users to manage and organize intake requests directly within these collaborative platforms, facilitating real-time communication, re-assignment, tagging, commenting, and file attachments.

OTHER AUTOMATION OPPORTUNITIES

While the free version of Power Automate does have certain limitations, such as restricted access to some actions and integrations, upgrading to the paid version unlocks a wide range of additional capabilities. The paid version offers expanded functionalities, such as enhanced customization options, advanced integrations with third-party applications, and increased capacity for handling a higher volume of requests. Below are some specific examples of integrations that are enabled with Premium:

- Initiate a UIPath Job
- Create and send a DocuSign envelope
- Invoke an HTTP Request (used to get emails from a shared inbox, which is particularly useful for Intake Management)
- Create and modify Jira issues
- Execute an Oracle or SQL query and insert, get, or update database rows
- Get, create, or modify Salesforce records

Power Automate can also be leveraged for other purposes, such as approval flows, automated reminders, daily digests, and more. The tool provides pre-built templates that offer inspiration and guidance for various automation scenarios, further expanding its potential applications.
